Do you know how to properly report?

According to the Sacramento Sheriff's Office (SO), if you think something should be reported . . . **report it!** Remember, reporting does not necessarily mean that you need an officer dispatched. The various methods of reporting may be found under "Other Crime Reporting Methods" in this brochure.

Due to budget cuts, the SO relies heavily on the public to be their "eyes and ears." Reporting suspicious or criminal activity may provide a critical piece of information that the SO needs to solve a crime or make an arrest. Reporting also helps to build accurate statistics about crime. This can and will affect the County's future decisions about law enforcement staffing needs for Rosemont. If, when a call is placed to the SO, an officer is dispatched, the call will automatically be added to the SO statistics. Otherwise, it is up to the caller to report by using another reporting method. (See "Other Crime Reporting Methods" on reverse side.)

To track your call for service ask the dispatcher for your "Event Number."
