3. Guest Speaker

- A. Dave Roland from SMUD r.e. the 2021 rate change proposal. The proposed increase is 1.5% on March 1st, 2022 which works out to about \$44 annually, and 2.0% on Jan 1st 2023, which is about \$59 annually. Current solar customers can stay at their current rate until 2030. New solar customers after Jan 1, 2022 will be at the rate of 7.4 cents per kilowatt hour.

- 4. **Status Reports** (in addition to those in the Board Packet)
 - a. Law Enforcement- CHP officer Trent Senter gave a brief presentation on a grant for motorcycle safety, and gave info on how to enroll in a motorcycle training program. Call 1-877-ride to enroll. We also had an extensive conversation around homelessness, with many questions around what the county plans to do now that the city has a master plan. Liz will take over officially as the NW chair.
 - b. County report by Jasmine Osmany- re homelessness RT has a clean up effort for Aug. 24th, mostly for garbage/hazards. There are still limits on removing people. Recall ballots will be mailed mid August. There will be increased air traffic at Mather bc Travis is currently closed. Residents can give feedback on county redistricting at Rancho Library on 9/1 at 6 pm. The County is to receive 3 million in CARES funding.
 - c. CRPD- no one present

 - e. Schools/Little Libraries- Schools are set to reopen to full in person instruction on September 2nd. Students who don't want to return can enroll in Independent Study. Mark Brittain repaired one of our little libraries, at no cost. Rosemont Reads volunteers donated 40 children's books. Alison distributed them throughout all the libraries. The Summer Reading challenge has been advertised on social media, and flyers were put in all the libraries.
 - f. RCF- County grant for \$4,000 to support families with athletic and recreational activities. RCF will also contribute \$3,000.
