



MINUTES OF REGULAR MONTHLY BOARD MEETING (ZOOM)
Held June 3, 2021

1. Meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.
2. Roll was taken.

Minutes of the May meeting and the May agenda were adopted. (L. Lott/T. Dugan)
3. A minute of silence was taken in memory of Gaylen Crane, an active Rosemont resident and member of RCA.
4. **Guest Speakers:**
Sara Ribeiro from the Sacramento Office of Education gave a presentation on bicycle helmet and pedestrian safety projects in the community.

Lisa Barsdale (Sacramento County Fire Marshall), Lee Miller (Residents Against Illegal Fireworks), and Dennis Revell (TNT Fireworks), addressed fireworks safety education, County mitigation plan, legislation on fireworks at the State level, illegal fireworks enforcement in the region, and the mobile app Nail 'Em.
5. **Reports and Updates (in addition to those in the Board packet)**
 - a. **Law Enforcement:**
CHP – Public Information Officer Trent Senter spoke about DUI (alcohol /drugs) violations and how to report them; DUI fatality statistics and consequences of driving under the influence. Car accident with moderate injuries (Jackson/Hedge) from red light running; fatal shooting on Hwy. 50/Bradshaw was gang related; car accident Rosemont/Mayhew (red flashing light intersection), vehicle pushed into the Golden Pond sign; minor injuries. Reports of vehicles running stop signs on many streets and speeding. Areas of concern reported to CHP via POP email. Rebecca Sloan expressed thanks and encouraged people to look for witnesses to report to the District Attorney's Office. Thanks to CHP for assistance in cleaning up homeless encampments at S. Watt with CalTrans.
SCSO – Reports on lewd acts (4) on the south side of Kiefer Blvd.; car burglaries, catalytic converter theft, home burglary.
Neighborhood Watch - Topic: Home and vehicle safety
 - b. **County** – Rebecca Sloan spoke on homeless camps on Jackson Rd. Illegal dumping along roads is not always due to the homeless. Homeless resources offered from social services and public health are not always received well by persons. RT clean up along Folsom Blvd. between La Riviera and Bradshaw. County also working with other neighborhood associations. Woman active with Butterfield Community Association was killed trying to help a homeless person along Folsom Blvd. After June 15 the County will open up. Vaccine clinics in more rural areas are expanding. County will continue to monitor cases and vaccines. Mental health, especially for youth, is a high priority for Public Health Dept. Rebecca will keep us updated on the issue of redistricting and can invite a speaker to attend our meeting over the summer.
 - c. **CRPD** – Terri Leimbach reported that wifi in Rosemont Park has not been scheduled. Pool at Hagan Park still scheduled to open on June 21. Cordova Golf Course attendance has seen a major increase; Beach Hut Deli may be contracted for concessions
 - d. **Education** - RCA Scholarships (\$1,500) were awarded to two Rosemont HS students: Haleigh Barlow will attend William Jessup Univ. (Psychology), and Kieu Anh Nguyen Le will attend Notre Dame (Journalism). They will be invited to the RCA July meeting.
 - e. **Census Analysis** - Terry Dugan contacted Rancho Cordova about helping us with census analysis and is waiting to hear back.
6. **Programs/Events**
 - a. **RCF Grant** - Dee Gavaldon has recalculated the budget and funds are ready to be allocated.
 - b. **Annual Membership Meeting** – This meeting is the time for elections, so we need to take care of board nominations, elections or appointments.

- c. **Dog/Cat Supply Drive-Thru** – 262 lbs. bagged food, 237 cans of food, 38 treats, 39 toys plus miscellaneous items collected. Donations made to Bradshaw Shelter, SPCA, Happy Tails, and Whisker Warriors. Also \$50 in cash was donated and will go to the Bradshaw non-profit TEAM (Teaching Everyone Animals Matter). Next drive-thru will be in July for school supplies; teaming up with Dorotcatherin Fatimah Thomas (the Backpack Lady), director of Homeo-Balance Academy who gives away free backpacks every year.
- d. **Food Trucks** - Frank contacted Sac MoFo about their schedule. They have a minimum attendance requirement. If the minimum is not met, RCA would have to pay the difference. Looking at other alternatives.
- e. **National Night Out** - Liz will find out about this year's National Night Out plans.
