REPORT ON ROSEMONT COMMUNITY POLES PHASE 2

The installation of 3 community poles in the south wing of the Butterfly Garden took place on 10/3/25. The groups from Chinese Immanuel Church and Supervisor Pat Hume's office assisted CRPD staff in spreading mulch throughout both wings.

The dedication ceremony took place on 10/11/25 with all three groups in attendance—Chinese Immanuel Church, Supervisor Pat Hume's Office, and Rosemont Little League. There were approximately 25-30 in attendance including members of each organization, CRPD staff /directors and neighbors. The re-painting of the Phase 1 poles was also celebrated. Pat Hume provided the refreshments, Atonement Lutheran Church lent us the chairs, and CRPD brought a canopy and staff to assist.

REPORT ON THE PUMPKIN GIVEAWAY & FOOD DRIVE

The event took place on 10/18/20 in front of Save Mart-Kiefer Blvd. Children (approx. 100) received free pumpkins, trick or treat goody bags, and books from Rosemont Reads. Garden City Church attended with their ice cream ambulance. Pumpkins funds were donated by Andre's Tree Service (\$150) and Joe Hart. Food donations benefitted Capital Compassion.
